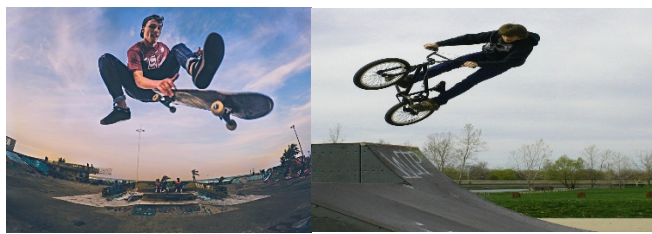
Diamond H Saddle Club Meeting



Tuesday, October 6th, 6:30pm, Bath County Extension Office

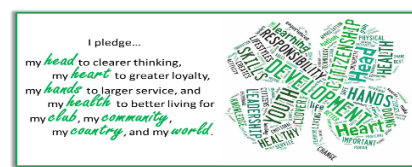

How to Ace That Job Interview



Searching for a new job can be a daunting task. It may take time to hear back from potential employers, so you must be patient during the process. When you get the call for an interview, here's some tips.

***Do Your Homework** – Research yourself online to get an idea how a potential employer may view you. Research the position you are applying for to see if it's a good fit for you.

***Look Smart** – Dress appropriate for the type of job, you are interviewing for. Arrive to the interview early.

***Project Confidence** – Believe you have something to offer to employer, minimize nervousness, maintain eye contact, speak clearly, etc.

***Prepare For Questions** – Rehearse possible questions. Bring past work experience and accomplishments.

***Conclude On a High Note** – Make sure to ask the interviewer questions about the position. Within a day or two, of the interview, follow-up with a thank you note by mail, email, or call. Don't harass employer with status of job.
