Farm License owners can make the donation of \$10 when renewing their farm license plates at the county clerk's office during the months of February & March. With more than 184,000 farm plates bought or renewed each year in Kentucky, the Commissioner's action can generate significant funds to support these three outstanding programs (Department of Ag, 4-H, and FFA). How it works, when you renew farm license plates tags donate \$10 and over \$6 of that stays here in the county for 4-H and FFA programs and activities that teach children and teens about leadership, citizenship, science and technology, communications, public speaking, agriculture, and more.


